Re: Broadcast Signal Lab Report on the State of FM Broadcasting in Grand Cayman

I wish to advise you that the Information and Communications Technology Authority (the "Authority") has completed its review of the Broadcast Signal Lab Report on the State of FM Broadcasting in Grand Cayman (the "BSL Report"). The Authority is currently preparing a formal determination on the proceeding. It is anticipated that this determination will be issued within the next few weeks.

In the interim, the Staff of the Authority has been instructed to notify Christian Communications Association ("CCA") and dms Broadcasting Ltd. ("dms") that the present interference with the signals of Paramount Media cannot continue. The Authority has therefore determined that Heaven 97.7, Gospel 88.7 and CayRock 96.5 will be required to relocate their transmitters out of George Town.

The Authority notes that, in its comments on the BSL Report, CCA proposed a change in the Heaven 97 frequency as a possible solution. In order to give the companies more time to plan and implement their exit from George Town, the Authority is prepared to consider this proposal as an interim measure. Accordingly, the Authority requires CCA

to confirm, no later than 18 July 2008, whether it is prepared to change the Heaven 97 frequency. If CCA is prepared to do so, the Authority will work with CCA and dms to identify an optimal interim frequency and implement this change of frequency no later than 11 August 2008. Once this change of frequency has been implemented, the Authority will conduct tests to confirm whether the blanketing issues identified in the BSL Report have been significantly reduced or eliminated. The Authority will assess the success of the trial and notify the parties of its findings no later than 18 August 2008.

If this change of frequency proves to be successful, the Heaven 97.7, Gospel 88.7 and CayRock 96.5 transmitters will be permitted to remain in their present location until the time of licence renewal. The licence renewal dates are currently set for 4 December 2008 and 15 July 2009 for CCA and dms, respectively. However, in order to give both licensees an equal amount of time to relocate their transmitters, the Authority will extend CCA's licence renewal date to 15 July 2009.

If the trial is unsuccessful, CCA and dms will be required to relocate the Heaven 97.7, Gospel 88.7 and CayRock 96.5 transmitters out of the George Town area (or to cease transmissions) within 30 days of receiving the notification from the Authority that the trial was unsuccessful. During this period, the Authority may require CCA and dms to take steps to minimize the amount interference, including by reducing their power levels or terminating the transmissions immediately.

The Authority wishes to emphasize that CCA and dms will be required to relocate the Heaven 97.7, Gospel 88.7 and CayRock 96.5 transmitters out of the George Town area, either in September 2008 or in July 2009. Therefore, the Authority urges CCA and dms to begin planning this relocation process as soon as possible to ensure that these stations remain on the air.
