Re: Relocation of Heaven 97, Gospel 88 and Cayrock 96.5 transmitters

Thank you for your letter of today's date requesting clarifications on the Authority's letter of 11 July 2008 regarding the relocation of the Heaven 97, Gospel 88 and Cayrock 96.5 transmitters out of George Town.

In answer to your question, the Authority wishes to clarify that its 11 July 2008 letter had two main objectives:

- (1) to eliminate interference resulting from the intermodulation product at 98.9 MHz, either by modifying the Heaven 97 frequency (no later than 11 August 2008) or by relocating the Heaven 97 transmitter outside of George Town (no later than 30 September 2008); and
- (2) to eliminate any blanketing in George Town by relocating the Heaven 97, Gospel 88 and Cayrock 96.5 transmitters out of George Town no later than July 2009.

On 15 July 2008, Christian Communication Association ("CCA") notified the Authority of its intention to change the frequency of Heaven 97, from 97.7 MHz to 97.5 MHz. Shortly thereafter, however, CCA advised the Authority that, after further consideration, it would prefer to relocate the Heaven 97 transmitter to Newlands. The Authority's Staff requested that CCA provide a specific implementation date and noted this proposal would be considered at the next ICTA Board meeting. To date, the Authority has not received a specific timetable from CCA.

Accordingly, the Authority considers that the terms of its 11 July 2008 letter, which requires either a change in the Heaven 97 frequency by 11 August 2008 or a relocation of the Heaven 97 transmitter by 30 September 2008, remain in effect. In other words, since CCA has decided not to modify the Heaven 97 frequency, it is now required to relocate the Heaven 97 transmitter out of George Town, no later than 30 September 2008. The Authority expects that this measure will address the first objective of its 11 July 2008 letter, i.e. to eliminate the intermodulation product at 98.9 MHz.

Separately, the Authority wishes to confirm that the Gospel 88 and Cayrock 96.5 transmitters must be relocated out of George Town no later than 15 July 2009. The Authority anticipates that the relocation of these transmitters will address the second objective of its 11 July 2008 letter, i.e. to eliminate any blanketing in George Town.

Should CCA and/or dms Broadcasting fail to comply with any of these requirements, the Authority reserves the right to take enforcement action, including, without limitation, the issuance of a cease and desist order under section 6 of the Interference and Equipment Standardization Regulations, 2004.
