Re: Dispute Arbitration on LNP Voting Rights

Telecayman does not agree with LIME that each member is not equal based on the ICTA Determination on LNP carrier contribution. Being responsible for 56.16% of the start up and monthly costs does not make LIME more important to the LNP process. Every carrier is equally important. Considering that the ICTA has stated that carriers can re-coup their start up and monthly costs by invoicing subscribers at the monthly rate of \$0.60 (startup) and \$0.20 (monthly) per line, I do not see how LIME is burdened with an unequal share.

Telecayman realizes that the Consortium in many instances will not have 100% agreement and proposes a democratic majority whereby more than 50% of the member votes are required to reach a decision. At present there are 4 members in the consortium and a clear majority would require 3 carriers in agreement.
