On a number of occasions TeleCayman has informally discussed the matter of equal access to long distance switching facilities in the Cayman Islands. While the liberalization agreement executed by the Government with Cable and Wireless last year did not specifically address the equal access issue, it is the stated objective of the Information & Communications Technology Authority to promote a competitive environment in telecommunications in the Cayman Islands.

TeleCayman contends that a fully competitive market for international long distance services cannot exist without provision of equal access to the switching facilities of *all* international carriers. TeleCayman's switch will have the ability to provide equal access from the outset on both a carrier pre-select and per call basis.


Based upon our understanding of Cable & Wireless switching network and the Ericsson switch technology, there exists no impediment to the immediate availability of equal access on their network. In fact, Cable & Wireless already provides such equal access within its own comprehensive service offering by providing 10-10-335 services in addition to its traditional 1-plus international long distance dialing.

TeleCayman herein requests an order from the Information & Communications Technology Authority to require all international long distance carriers to provide equal access long distance dialing by May 1, 2004. Should the dominant carrier not be in a position to provide equal access by that date, we request that on an interim basis, Cable & Wireless be required to institute a specific tariff for provision of 10-10-XXX resale services to other licenced international carriers. The tariff for this resale service should be based upon causal costs.

For reference purposes, resellers in Canada can utilize 10-10-XXX services from Bell Canada on the basis of the actual revenues obtained less a 2.5% fee for billing and collection and a ten cent per active account fee per month and a three cent charge per call.
