## International Codes & Standards Adopted Pursuant to Section 10 (5) of the The Dangerous Substances Law (2017 Revision)

## July 2019

Section 10 of the Dangerous Substances Law (2017 Revision) ("**DS Law**") sets out the general provision relating to the role and function of the Chief Fuels Inspector, among which is to establish the relevant international Codes, Standards and Best Practices in force in the Cayman Islands.

Below is a list of established codes and standards, and international bodies and organisations whose specific materials and extracts are adopted in part in the Cayman Islands and have the force of law to enable the Chief Fuels Inspector to carry out the functions of the Office under the DS Law -

- 12. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR);
- 13. Underwriters Laboratory (UL);
- 14. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA);
- 15. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and
- 16. International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code (UN/IMDG).
