Christen served as the Deputy Chief Officer in the Ministry of Education with responsibility for Finance, Administration, Labour, Gender Affairs, Schools Expansion Projects and Special Units from 2009 to 2014. He subsequently served as the Chief Officer in the Ministry from 2014 to 2018 with full responsibility for all its portfolios.

Notable achievements include the significant update and strengthening of the

National Pensions Act, introduction of the Education Act, establishment of the National Minimum Wage, Extension of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms for Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) to the Cayman Islands, completion of the Clifton Hunter High School and John Gray High School Gym as well as several Primary School expansion and community walking track projects.
